**JUNIOR CHOIR** rehearses on Sundays in the parish church, gathering in the choir stalls at 12.30pm after the service.

**YOUNG CHURCH** gathers after the Collect at the foot of the choir steps before proceeding to the Crypt for their teaching; they re-join the congregation for Communion. Parents with babies and younger children may use the Browning Room, where a speaker relays the service. Children must be accompanied to or from the Browning Room and must never be left unattended.

O God, the strength of all them that put their trust in thee, mercifully accept our prayers and, because through the weakness of our mortal nature we can do no good thing without thee, grant us the help of thy grace that, in keeping of thy commandments, we may please thee, both in will and deed; through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Everlasting Father, we thank thee that thou dost nourish us with these thy heavenly gifts: by this sacrament strengthen us in faith, build us up in hope and make us grow in love; for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

## MUSIC NOTES

**Orlando de Lassus** was born in Mons (Hainaut) in 1532 and died in Munich in 1594. He was one of the most gifted and prolific composers of his time, and although little is known about his early life, legend has it that he was three times abducted because of the beauty of his voice. It was during his time as *maestro di capella* in Munich that Lassus wrote much of his liturgical music. Possibly composed by Lassus' student, Johannes Eccard, the *Missa Mon cœur se recommande à vous* is a parody mass, based on a chanson by Lassus. It is a bright and sunny work, making good use of its 5-part scoring.

**Lodovico da Viadana** (c. 1560–1627) was choirmaster at the cathedral in Mantua in the 1590s. He was an important figure in the development of the early Baroque technique of basso continuo, and figured bass. *Exultate justi* is a buoyant setting of verses of Psalm 33. Particularly notable is the way Viadana 'word-paints' the text with musical figures that portray the psalter, harp and 'instrument of ten strings'!

Text and Translation:

*Exultate, justi, in Domino;*

*rectos decet collaudatio.*

*Confitemini Domino in cithara;*

*in psalterio decem chordarum psallite illi.*

*Cantate ei canticum novum;*

*bene psallite ei in vociferations*

*Rejoice in the Lord, O ye just;*

*praise befits the upright.*

*Give praise to the Lord on the harp;*

*sing to him with the psaltery, the instrument of ten strings.*

*Sing to him a new canticle,*

*sing well unto him with a loud noise.*

**William Byrd** (1543-1623), Organist of Lincoln Cathedral and Gentleman of the Chapel Royal, is arguably the most significant English church musician of his day. The quality of his vocal music is second to none, and as significant is his establishment of a truly English style of instrumental writing. Perhaps it is for these reasons that his Roman Catholicism was at least partially tolerated, although he and his wife were not without their share of trouble from the authorities. Many of the fine Latin-texted works he composed were for the private, illegal services, at which Byrd was often present. His setting of *Ego sum panis vivus* comes from his publication of Latin Motets *Gradualia II* published in 1607. The text comes from John 6: vv51-52:

Text/translation

*Ego sum panis vivus, qui de caelo descendi.*

*Si quis manducaverit ex hoc pane, vivet in aeternum, alleluia.*

*I am the living bread which came down from heaven.*

*Whosoever shall eat of this bread shall live forever, alleluia.*
