MUSIC NOTES

Antonio Lotti (1667–1740) made his career at St Mark's in Venice, eventually becoming *maestro di cappella* in 1736; a position he held until his death. In 1717 he was given a two-year leave to go to Dresden, where a number of his operas were produced. Lotti also wrote many masses, cantatas, madrigals, and instrumental pieces, and despite much of his music forming a bridge between the baroque and classical styles, the *Missa octavi toni* harks back to the 'stile antico' imitative techniques of the Italian renaissance composers.

Herbert Howells (1892-1983) wrote much church music inspired by the great English choral tradition: its buildings and the people who worked in them. Written in 1913, *O Salutaris hostia* begins by quoting a simple harmonisation of a 17th Century German hymn tune from the 1906 English Hymnal. The composer proceeds to elaborate a second verse, with gentle counterpoint and plainsong-like melodic lines.

Sit sempiterna gloria,	Immortal Godhead, One in Three.
Qui vitam sine termino	O grant us endless length of days,
Nobis donet in patria.	In our true native land with thee.

Stravinsky rejoined the Russian Orthodox Church (from which he had been estranged for twenty-five years) in 1926. His setting of the *Ave Maria*, the 3rd of three short a capella works was completed in 1934. Originally in Slavonic, the composer adapted the work to the Latin text in 1949.
