YOUNG CHURCH gathers after the Collect at the foot of the choir steps before proceeding to the Crypt for their teaching; they re-join the congregation Communion. for Parents with babies and younger children may use the Browning Room, where a speaker relays the service. Children must be accompanied to or from the Browning Room and must never be left unattended.

Collect of the Week:

O God, whose blessed Son was manifested that he might destroy the works of the devil and make us the children of God and heirs of eternal life: grant us, we beseech thee, that, having this hope, we may purify ourselves, even as he is pure, that when he shall appear again with power and great glory we may be made like unto him in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where with thee, O Father, and thee, O Holy Spirit, he liveth and reigneth, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Post Communion Prayer:

Gracious Lord, who in this holy sacrament dost give substance to our hope: bring us at the last to that fullness of life for which we long; through Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen**

MUSIC NOTES

Joseph Rheinberger (1839-1901) studied organ and composition at the Munich Conservatory. His Mass in E flat dates from 1878, and is dedicated to Pope Leo XIII. It makes excellent and varied use of its eight-part scoring and demonstrates the contrapuntal mastery that might be expected of a man renowned for his teaching of fugue and composition. Betraying the influence of the Venetian choral tradition (the juxtaposition of two separate choirs), the Gloria uses the sumptuous harmonic language that is employed throughout the Mass. The largely syllabic Gloria is balanced by the (relatively) large proportions of the remaining movements, where there is more repetition of text and development of ideas. The warmth of the E flat major tonality is made all the more effective by the deviations from this key, serving to convey the affekt of the text and give the mass a somewhat symphonic structure. This is underlined in the instrumentally conceived ending of the Agnus Dei, here the long-term harmonic planning contributes to the success of this closing section.

Sir Hubert Parry (1848-1918) was an influential figure in the revival of British music. He was highly regarded as both scholar and composer, and for several years combined the post of Heather Professor of Music at Oxford University with the Directorship of the RCM. Taken from his 'Songs of farewell', *My soul, there is a country* sets words of Henry Vaughan.

Herbert Howells (1892-1983) wrote his anthem *O pray for the peace of Jerusalem* during the Second World War (1941), and it is characteristic of his output – long, sonorous vocal phrases, rich harmonic climaxes, and ending with a recapitulation of the opening.

If you are a UK higher-rate taxpayer, you can also receive back up to 31.5% of your gift through a tax reclaim if you have registered for Gift Aid. Our Giving by Text provider DONATETM provides a means for you to reclaim any Gift Aid on donations made by registering for Gift Aid when giving through DONATETM, but you only need to do this once for all future transactions on DONATETM to be Gift Aided automatically. You can monitor all of your own donations on the platform and submit an easy personal Gift Aid reclaim at the end of the year to www.hmrc.gov.uk You can give £5 or £10 or multiples thereof by simply texting at any time.
