MUSIC NOTES

Juan Gutiérrez de Padilla was born in Malaga, Southern Spain in c. 1590. He held posts at Jerez de la Frontera, as Maestro De Capilla back at Malaga (where he had received his musical training) and then from 1616 as Maestro at Cadiz Cathedral. He was in New Spain (an area now known as Mexico) by the autumn of 1622 as Cantor and Assistant Maestro at Puebla Cathedral. Following his promotion to the post of Maestro de Capilla in 1629, he remained in Puebla until his death in 1664. His compositional output shows him the equal of any peninsular composer in terms of both talent and technique.

In the Missa Ego flos campi (based on an unknown model) flowing melodic contours of the Old Spain are utilised, combined with the toe-tapping rhythms of the New Spain. The musical provision at Puebla was extravagant, including a choir of 14 boys and 28 men who sat in two rows facing each other. This arrangement lends itself well to the juxtaposition of the two opposing four-part choirs heard in this Mass. Frequent use of syncopation and repetition of text, perhaps for structural or didactic purposes, make this a work of great vitality.

His setting of *Exultate justi* is brilliant in its vitality.

Text and translation:

Exsultate, justi, in Domino; rectos decet collaudatio.

Confitemini Domino in cithara; in psalterio decem chordarum psallite illi.

Cantate ei canticum novum ; bene psallite ei in vociferatione.

Quia rectum est verbum Domini, et omnia opera ejus in fide.

Diligit misericordiam et judicium; misericordia Domini plena est terra.

Verbo Domini cæli firmati sunt, et spiritu oris ejus omnis virtus eorum.

Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous: for it becometh well the just to be thankful.

Praise the Lord with harp: sing praises unto him with the lute, and instrument of ten strings.

Sing unto the Lord a new song: sing praises lustily unto him with a good courage.

For the word of the Lord is true: and all his works are faithful.

He loveth righteousness and judgement: the earth is full of the goodness of the Lord.

By the word of the Lord were the heavens made: and all the hosts of them by the breath of his mouth.

Andrew Parnell (b. 1954) is a British organist and harpsichordist, and from 1976 was Assistant Master of the Music at the Cathedral and Abbey Church of St Alban, as well as Master of Music and choirmaster at St Albans School, where he founded the St Albans Abbey Girls' Choir in 1996, which is now a regular part of the worshipping community. *Oculi omnium* is an atmospheric setting of verses from Psalm 145, originally scored for ATTBB, it is here transposed up a minor third, thus making it suitable for SATBB. Even at the higher pitch this largely homophonic piece retains a rich sonority.

Giving by Text: You can Gift Aid your text donation. Gift Aid increases the value of your donation if you are a UK taxpayer. Basic rate tax is 20 per cent meaning that if you give £10 and add Gift Aid, it's worth £12.50 to us. If you are a UK higher-rate taxpayer, you can also receive back up to 31.5% of your gift through a tax reclaim if you have registered for Gift Aid. Our Giving by Text provider DONATETM provides a means for you to reclaim any Gift Aid on donations made by registering for Gift Aid when giving through DONATETM, but you only need to do this once for all future transactions on DONATETM to be Gift Aided automatically. You can monitor all of your own donations on the platform and submit an easy personal Gift Aid reclaim at the end of the year to www.hmrc.gov.uk You can give £5 or £10 or multiples thereof by simply texting at any time.
