# MEMORIAL TABLETS IN ST.MARYLEBONE PARISH CHURCH

# Commencing from behind the Pulpit and moving clockwise

## 1. Tablet

In Memory of Lt. Colonel RICHARD FITZGERALD of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Life Guards, who fell in the XLIII year of his age in the field of Waterloo, and of GEORGIANA ISOBELLA SIMHA D'AGUILAR his widow, who died 11<sup>th</sup>December MDCCCXXL aged LXIII years. Her remains are deposited in the vault beneath.

# 2. Tablet

Sacred to the dearly loved and honoured memory of LOUISA STEWARD HARCOURT, COUNTESS OF BEVERLEY, Daughter of the Hon. James Archibald Stuart Wortley Mackenzie; Wife of George Percy, Second Earl of Beverley, who became 5<sup>th</sup> Duke of Northumberland 17 years after her death. She was born 1779, died January 30<sup>th</sup> 1848 and is buried in the church in the vault of the Earls of Beverley.

#### 3. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of BENJAMIN BURTON ESQUIRE, of Pollerton in the County of Carlow and of Gloucester Place, Portman Square, second son of Sir Charles Burton, Bart. and Grandson of John, Lord Desert. Died January 3<sup>rd</sup> 1834, aged 43 Also

ANN GRACE, widow of the above, who died December 12<sup>th</sup> 1837, aged 42 Also

FRANCIS CONYNGHAM, fourth son of the above, who died December 7th 1837, aged 4 years 8 months.

Also

ROBERT BENJAMIN LAWRENCE, son of the above. Died April 14th 1842, aged 18. buried at Kensal Green

#### 4. Tablet

To the memory of two brothers, the only sons of the late Stephen HAVEN Esquire and of Lydia, his wife. WILLIAM GORDON, departed this life on the 18<sup>th</sup> November 1809, aged 8 years 9 months. CHARLES MACKINNON, died on the 14<sup>th</sup> April 1824 in the 21<sup>st</sup> year of his age.

#### 5. Tablet

In the family vault beneath this church are deposited the remains of EMMA CATHERINE BAMPFYLDE, only child of Sir George Warwick Bampfylde, Bart. And Dame Emma Penelope, his wife, who died on the 26<sup>th</sup> March 1825 aged 14 years.

#### 6. Window

To the Glory of God and in loving memory of MARGARITA VICTORIA GOODWIN, died 29th March 1953

#### 7. Inscription beneath window.

In loving memory of SARAH MORTIMER, wife of Albert BARNES of York Terrace, Regents Park, who died 23<sup>rd</sup> August 1884. The gift of her husband.

#### 8. Tablet

To the memory of MRS ELIZABETH GERTRUDE BAYFIELD, wife of John Wolsey Bayfield, of the County of Norfolk, Gent. Who departed this life March 3<sup>rd</sup> 1832, aged 62 years. Her remains are interred in a vault under the church near this spot.

#### 9. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of JOHN MACCAMON ESQUIRE, late of Gloucester Place, in this Parish, who died on the XIII May MDCCCXVIII aged XLIX years. His mortal remains are interred in a vault beneath this church.

# 10. Tablet

In loving memory of WILLIAM HENRY WHITE, M.A. M.D., Born 8<sup>th</sup> May 1849, died 22<sup>nd</sup> October 1926, also of SARAH ANNE his wife, born 17<sup>th</sup> June 1849 died 24<sup>th</sup> January 1926. Their remains lie in the crypt of this church.

#### 11. Tablet

Sacred to the Memory of JOHN COTTON ESQUIRE, late of the Bengal Civil Service, who died on the 18<sup>th</sup> June 1828 in the 63<sup>rd</sup> year of his age. His remains are deposited in a vault beneath this church.

#### 12. Window

ERNEST HAROLD DRINKWATER, 20th January 1938

#### **13.** Inscription beneath window

To the Glory of God and in memory of JOHN REA CAMPBELL, died March 9th 1884

#### 14. Tablet

To the memory of JAMES CRUIKSHANK ESQUIRE of Ballards Valley, St. Mary's in the Island of Jamaica, and of Gloucester Place, Portman Square. He died 25<sup>th</sup> November 1831 aged 70 years.

Sacred also to the memory of MARY DANSEY, only daughter of James Cruikshank Esquire and Mary, his wife. The wife of George Cornwallis DANSEY, Major in His Majesty's Royal Regiment of Artillery, who died 14<sup>th</sup> February 1830 aged 33 years.

#### 15. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of LETTICE, second daughter of the late Thomas PATTEN of Banks Hall, Esquire, and Dorothea his wife, daughter of the late Peter Bold Esquire, both in the County Palatine of Lancaster. The above LETTICE PATTEN died Dec. 21<sup>st</sup> 1817 and is interred in a vault in this church.

#### 16. Tablet

WALLACE HOWARD DAVIS, Lieutenant Sherwood Foresters, Fell fighting in the Great War July 1<sup>st</sup> 1917. With affection and pride he is remembered by his colleagues and friends – the Masters in the St Marylebone Central School.

#### 17. Tablet

In a vault beneath this church lie the remains of EDWARD RAVENSCROFT ESQUIRE, of Portland Place, who died Aug. 19<sup>th</sup> 1828. Descended from an ancient family in Cheshire, Also in remembrance of EMMA relict of Edward Ravenscroft Esquire, who died at 12 Portland Place on the 7<sup>th</sup> August 1848 in the 84<sup>th</sup> year of her age. Her remains are interred in the east vault beneath this church.

#### **18.** Inscription below window

In loving memory of JOHN BOYES who died 26th October 1884 in his 77th year.

#### 19. Tablet

In the vault beneath are deposited the remains of SIR JOHN SEWELL, late of Cumberland Street in this Parish, and of Wick Hill House, Berks, Knight. Doctor of Civil Law of Pembroke College Oxford and of the College of Advocates, London. Judge of the Vice Admiralty Court of Malta from its establishment until the year 1815. A Deputy Lieutenant of Berkshire; One of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the same County and for Middlesex. F.R.S., and F.S.A. It pleased Providence to terminate his useful and honourable life on the 15<sup>th</sup> January 1833 in the 67<sup>th</sup> year of his age.

#### 20. Tablet

This monument is erected as a humble tribute of gratitude and respect to the memory of SIR JAMES SIBBALD, BART. Whose remains are deposited with those of ELIZABETH his wife, in a vault in Maryle-bone Churchyard. He died beloved and esteemed by all who knew him on the 17<sup>th</sup> September 1819 in the 77<sup>th</sup> year of his age.

#### 21. Tablet

To the Glory of God and in memory of JOHN WHITE, Lieutenant Commandeer Royal Navy. Killed in action on the 23<sup>rd</sup> October 1916 while in command of H.M.S.GENISTA. This tablet is erected by officers and men his former shipmates in H.M.S. AFRICA.

#### 22. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of WILLIAM AND MARTHA JOACHIM who were for many years residents in this Parish, and whose beloved remains repose beneath a tomb in the Burial Ground on the South Side of Paddington Street.

MARTHA JOACHIM, Spinster, daughter of the above, whose remains are deposited in the same tomb.

### 23. Window

Erected by all Ranks of the Queens Own Cameron Highlanders in the memory of their Founder Sir ALAN CAMERON OF Erracht, K.C.B. who was buried in the graveyard of this church 1827.

#### 24. Inscription beneath window

This window is placed by John Ynyr Burges of Parkanaur in memory of his uncle SIR WILLIAM JOHNSTON, Bart, of Gilford, County Down and Bryanston Square, who rests in the vault below

## 25. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of SOLOMON FRANCO ESQUIRE, who departed this life on 27<sup>th</sup> day of March 1825, aged 46 years and whose remains are deposited in a vault beneath this church. Also his wife, FRANCES FRANCO, who died in Paris on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of February 1845 aged 53 years. Also his sister, SARAH FRANCO, who died on the 6<sup>th</sup> August 1835 aged 66 years. Also FRANCIS FRANCO ESQUIRE, his relative, who died 1<sup>st</sup> February 1837, aged 83 years

#### 26. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of ELIZABETH MARY BOOTH, who departed this life on the 26<sup>th</sup> December 1820 aged 57 years.

#### 27. Wooden Plaque. Forset Family

"These pewes vnscovd and tannin sunder to wit a valt for byrial" there is which EDWARD FORSET made for him and his.

#### 28. Tablet

In memory of MRS MARTHA UDNY, widow of Robert Udny, formerly of Teddington, Esquire. Sub-Governess of her late Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte of Wales. In the midst of jarring interests she secured the respect and affection of her Royal pupil and the approbation of His Majesty. She was born in 1761 and died 1<sup>st</sup> September 1831 aged 70 years, and lies interred in the vaults of this church.

#### 29. Inscription beneath window

In loving memory of EMMA wife of Loombe Culham BROOKE, who died 24<sup>th</sup> October 1876 The gift of her husband.

#### **30. Tablet Beneath**

In loving memory of LOOMBE CULHAM BROOKE, born 23rd July 1847 died 3rd February 1924

#### 31. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of REBECCA PHIPPS, the beloved wife of HENRY MORETON-DYER ESQUIRE, of this Parish, who died on the 12<sup>th</sup> August 1830, and whose mortal remains are deposited in the family vault beneath this church.

#### 32. Tablet

In memory of HENRY OSCAR PALMER, eldest son of HENRY JAMES and HARIET MATILDA PALMER of this Parish. He died at Bloemfontein on the 27<sup>th</sup> May 1900 in the South Africa Campaign, aged 23 years.

#### 33. Tablet

In memory of the REVEREND ALEXANDER CROMBIE, LLD, FRS, of York Terrace, Regents Park and Pheado, Kincardineshire, who departed this life on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of June 1840, aged 78 years.

#### 34. Tablet

To the memory of RICHARD COSWAY ESQUIRE, Principal Painter to His Royal Highness, George, Prince of Wales. He died July 1821 aged 80 years. His widow Martha Cosway erects this memorial.

#### 35. Tablet

Sacred to the much respected memory of WILLIAM FAIRLIE ESQUIRE, formerly of Calcutta who departed this life on the 19<sup>th</sup> June 1825, aged 72 years, and also of MARGARET, wife of the above WILLIAM FAIRLIE ESQUIRE, who died 2<sup>nd</sup> March 1845, aged 64 years.

#### 36. Tablet

DAVID CLARK ESQUIRE, late of Calcutta, born 20<sup>th</sup> November 1779, died 18<sup>th</sup> June 1838. This tablet is erected by a few of his many friends to perpetuate the remembrance and liberal munificence

displayed during a long residence in India, and by the desire of his relatives the name of his brother is also inscribed on the tablet.

JOHN CLARK ESQUIRE, late of Jamaica, born 16th November 1778, died 14th Feb. 1814

#### 37. Tablet

To the memory of THE REVEREND DOCTOR JOHN VARDILL, obit Jan. 16<sup>th</sup> 1811 Aetat 60. Rector of Skirbeck and Fishtoft, Lincolnshire. First and Last Regius Professor of Divinity in King's College, New York, where, like his distinguished ancestor Sir John Wardell of Wharfdale, he sacrificed his inheritance to public spirit which his vigorous genius diffused and his benign philanthropy ennobled.

#### 38. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of URBAN VIGORS ESQUIRE, Lieutenant General in the Honourable East India Company's Service. He died April 10<sup>th</sup> 1815 aged 68 years.

#### **39.** Tablet

Sacred to the memory of WILLIAM HUMPHREY, son of the Reverend William Green and Frances HUMPHREY, who departed this life 9<sup>th</sup> Feb. 1839 aged 82 years. His mortal remains are interred in St. Marylebone Burial Ground.

#### 40. Tablet

In a family vault beneath this church are interred the mortal remains of THOMAS WARRE ESQUIRE, who died on the 31stt July 1821 in the 73<sup>rd</sup> year of his age. This tablet is also sacred to the memory of ASHLEY GEORGE WARRE, third son of John Ashley and Florence Catherine WARRE, who died 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1893 in the 4<sup>th</sup> year of his age and is interred in the same vault.

#### 41. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of CLAUD RUSSELL ESQUIRE, formerly Member in the Government of Fort St. George in the East Indies. Died on 17<sup>th</sup> April 1820. He was born in Edinburgh 18<sup>th</sup> October 1733. His remains are deposited in a vault beneath this spot.

#### 42. Tablet

Sacred to the memore of LOUISA relict of GEORGE LITTLE ESQUIRE, of Amagh in the County of Longford, Ireland. Youngest daughter of the late William Hornby Esquire of the Hook, Hampshire and Portman Square, London, who departed this life on the 8<sup>th</sup> May 1834 aged 63.

Also to the memory of JOHN HORNBY LITTLE third son of the above who was taken from this world after much suffering on the 29<sup>th</sup> December 1829 aged 33 years.

#### 43. Tablet

To the memory of BENJAMIN OAKLEY Junior, son of Benjamin OAKLEY of Tavistock Square, who died 21<sup>st</sup> Nov. 1815 aged 17 years. He was interred in the church of Tooting Graveney in the county of Surrey, removed thence by a faculty from the Bishop of Winchester and deposited in the family vault beneath this monument on the 15<sup>th</sup> Feb. 1817. Also of

FANNY OAKLEY, who died on the 10<sup>th</sup> Feb. 1817 aged 11 years. Also of

BENJAMIN OAKLEY, father of the above, aged 77 years. Born at Weobley, Herefordshire and died in Sloane Street Apl. 19<sup>th</sup> 1844. Also of –

HANNAH MARCY ANN OAKLEY, relict of the above, who died Jan. 20th 1847, aged 73 years.

#### 44. Tablet

In memory of LIEUTENANT GENERAL JOHN GORDON, Hon. East India Company's Service. Eldest son of the Hon. Colonel Gordon of Aboyne. Died 26<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1832, aged 62 years.

#### 45. Window

In this church was solemnised the marriage of ROBERT BROWNING AND ELIZABETH BARRETT  $12^{\text{th}}$  September 1846

#### 46. Tablet

The mortal remains of ISABEL wife of John HARDY Esquire, Member of Parliament for the Borough of Bradford, are deposited in a catacomb under this church. She died Jan. 11<sup>th</sup> 1834 aged 51, leaving her husband, 3 sons and 8 surviving daughters to lament the loss of a beloved wife and exemplary mother

#### 47. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of THE HONORABLE ELLEN MARY, the affectionate and beloved wife of Captain Edward Charles FLETCHER of the 1<sup>st</sup> Life Guards, and the youngest daughter of John Lord Teignmouth, who died a few days after giving birth to her third child, on 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 1835, aged 31 years. Her mortal remains are deposited beside those of her parents in a private vault beneath this church.

Also to the memory of THE REVEREND ROBERT ANDERSON, Born Apl. 29<sup>th</sup> 1792, died Mch 22<sup>nd</sup> 1843, aged 50. He married the Hon Caroline D. Shore, third daughter of John, Lord Teignmouth.

#### 48. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of COLONEL HUGH HENRY MITCHELL, Of the 51<sup>st</sup> Regiment of Foot. He was the son of Hugh Henry Mitchell Esquire of County of Cork. Married 3<sup>rd</sup> July 1804 Lady Hariet Isabella Elizabeth Somerset, daughter of the 5<sup>th</sup> Duke of Beaufort, and departed this life Apl. 20<sup>th</sup> 1817 in the 47<sup>th</sup> year of his age.

#### 49. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of JOHN LORD TEIGNMOUTH, President of the British and Foreign Bible Society from its formation to his death, a period of 30 years, and formerly Governor General of India, who died aged 82 years on the 1<sup>st</sup> Feb. 1834, and of his beloved and affectionate wife CHARLOTTE, LADY TEIGNMOUTH who died aged 73 years on the 13<sup>th</sup> July of the same year.

Their mortal remains are deposited in a private vault beneath this church.

Sacred also to the memory of their children who departed this life before them CAROLINE ISABELLA and EMILY, who died in their infancy 1793, and whose remains are buried under the church of OTTERY ST.MARY in the county of Devon, and of CAPTAIN THE HONOURABLE HENRY DUNDAS SHORE, formerly Lieutenant of His Majesty's 4<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Dragoon Guards, who died in the South of France whither he had repaired for the restoration of his health shattered by an eastern climate, on the 28<sup>th</sup> April 1828 aged 26 years. A monument to his memory is erected over his grave in the Protestant Cemetery of Lourmarin in the Department of Vaucluse.

#### 50. Tablet

In a vault near this place are deposited the remains of CHARLOTTE COUNTESS OF BEAUCHAMP, only daughter of John, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Clonmell, who departed this life 26<sup>th</sup> April 1846 in the 58<sup>th</sup> year of her age. JOHN REGINALD PINDAR, 3<sup>rd</sup> EARL OF BEAUCHAMP, husband of the above, born at Madresfield Court, Worcester, 22<sup>nd</sup> Nov. 1783, died 22<sup>nd</sup> Jan. 1853 in the 70<sup>th</sup> year of his age.

### 51. Tablet

Near this place are deposited the remains of MARGARET, COUNTESS OF CLONMELL, relict of John, Earl of Clonmell, Lord Chief Justice of Ireland. She expired on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord 1829, in the 67<sup>th</sup> year of her age.

#### 52. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of ROBERT POWNEY ESQUIRE, who departed this life 15<sup>th</sup> Oct. 1817 aged 62 years. His remains are deposited in a vault beneath.

#### 53. Tablet

In memory of WILLIAM DOUGLAS MORRISON, Rector of St. Marylebone 1908-1942. Died 13<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1943 and his dearly loved wife ALICE MORRISON, died 4<sup>th</sup> May 1957

#### 54. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of JOHN BEBB ESQUIRE, of Gloucester Place, Portman Square, and Donnington Grove, Berkshire, who died 27<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1830 in the 76<sup>th</sup> year of his age. Near this he rests. Also of JANET LAURENCE BEBB, widow of the above, who died 7<sup>th</sup> April 1850, in the 85<sup>th</sup> year of her age.

#### 55. Inscription beneath window

In loving memory of ROBERT STANLEY MANSEL who died in the Parish, Mch. 15th 1881 aged 54 years

#### 56. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of JOSEPH FERNANDEZ MADRID, Envoy Extraordinary and minister Plenipotentiary from the republic of Colombia to his Britannic Majesty. Born Feb. 21<sup>st</sup> 1789 died June 28<sup>th</sup> 1830

57. Tablet

Underneath are deposited the remains of MAJOR ARTHUR BALFOUR, Born at Balingry in Fifeshire 1752, dd 14<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1817. At a very early age he entered in the service of the East India Company in Bengal. Highly respected and beloved by all who knew him he left this world most sincerely lamented by his relations and numerous friends.

## 58. Tablet

In loving memory of Lieutenant GERALD DAVID LOMAX, 3<sup>rd</sup> Welch Regiment, who was mortally wounded on May 9<sup>th</sup> 1915 when fighting for his country at Fromelles with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Berkshire Regiment. He died on May 10<sup>th</sup> on a Hospital barge on the Lys and lies buried in the cemetery at Eszaires.

## 59. Tablet

In loving memory of PETER FRANCIS NAPIER LOMAX, Pilot Officer in the Royal Air Force. Killed on active service on 24<sup>th</sup> February 1940 at the age of 19 years.

#### 60. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of CLEMENTINA, wife of Vice Admiral Sir Pulteney MALCOLM, C.B. and daughter of the Hon. William Fullerton Elphinstone. Born 14<sup>th</sup> April 1775, died 19<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1830

#### 61. Window

In memory of EDWARD LAMBERT of York Terrance, Regents Park, who died on the 4<sup>th</sup> Mch. 1884, the gift of his widow Ann Alderson Lambert.

#### 62. Tablet

In memory of ISABELLA MARY wife of John FAIRLIE Esquire, born 17<sup>th</sup> Mch.1807 died 23<sup>rd</sup> January 1830.

JOHN Infant son of John and Isabella FAIRLIE, born 9<sup>th</sup> Feb. 1828 died 3<sup>rd</sup> Jan. 1892 JOHN CANTERBURY, infant son of John and Isabella FAIRLIE, born 11<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1832, died 31 Jan. 1843 LOUISA, second wife of John FAIRLIE Esquire, born 3<sup>rd</sup> Oct. 1809, died 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1843.

#### 63. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of BENJAMIN HOWTON ESQUIRE, upwards of 60 years a resident of this Parish, who departed this life on the 11<sup>th</sup> March 1819 in the 81<sup>st</sup> year of his age. His remains are deposited in a vault beneath.

#### 64. Tablet

In memory of J.CHALMERS BROWN, M.B.C.N., who died December 24<sup>th</sup> 1900. Erected by his friends and patients.

#### 65. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of ANNA MARIA, wife of George CARRINGTON Esquire, of Missenden Abbey in the County of Bucks. Obit 19<sup>th</sup> August 1829.

#### 66. Window

To the Glory of God this window was placed here by the members of the St. Marylebone Guild 1885.

#### 67. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of EDMUND ALEXANDER HOWARD ESQUIRE, son of the late Gerrard HOWARD Esquire of Frognall Hall, Hampstead. A Magistrate and Deputy Lieutenant for the County and a relative of the 10<sup>th</sup> Duke of Norfolk, who died at his house in York Place, Portman Square on the 11<sup>th</sup> March 1827, aged 60. Also of HENRIETTA CHARLOTTE HOWARD, relict of the above, who died at her house in York Place, Portman Square, on the 27<sup>th</sup> September 1847, aged 69. Their remains are in a vault in this church.

#### 68. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of SIR WILLIAM FRASER, F.S.R. one of the Elder Brethren of Trinity House and formerly commander in the Hon. East India Company's Naval Service. He departed this life at his house in Bedford Square on the 13<sup>th</sup> February 1818 in the 78th year of his age, leaving a widow with 3 sons and 11 daughters.

#### 69. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of Lt. GENERAL WILLIAM ST. LEGER, who commenced his military life at the age of 16 years in the 17<sup>th</sup> Light Dragoons then serving in America. He highly distinguished himself by his gallantry in that and other regiments. He also served during a long and honourable career to the

latest period of his health, in Europe and Asia, and after a life of unremitting exertion in the service of his country departed this life on the 28<sup>th</sup> March 1818 in the 58<sup>th</sup> year of his age. (Note. He is buried in a vault beneath the church)

### 70. Brass

This tablet is placed as a tribute of love to the dear memory of **CONSTANCE AUGUSTA MEREDYTH** of this City, aged 42, who entered into the Kingdom of God on August 15<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1912

# 71. Tablet

Erected to the memory of GILBERT HALL ESQUIRE, a native of Edinburgh, formerly a Surgeon of the service of the Hon. East India Company at Calcutta, but late of Manchester Street, Manchester Square. He died on the 20<sup>th</sup> March 1820 aged 58 years, and is interred in the vault of this church.

# 72. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of EDWARD TERRENCE HEARD ESQUIRE, Lieutenant Royal Flying Corps, formerly of 2<sup>nd</sup> Kind Edward's Horse Guards who fought in the Great war from 1914 and made the supreme sacrifice while flying on service 17<sup>th</sup> May 1918.

# 73. Tablet

In memory of WALPOLE EYRE GREENWELL OF St. Marylebone, whose body rests in the cemetery at East Finchley. Born 14<sup>th</sup> November 1819, died 13<sup>th</sup> March 1897.

#### 74. Brass

In memory of JOHN WILLIAM LEONARD ESQUIRE, C.M.G. OF York Terrace, N.W. born 12<sup>th</sup> June 1832 died 15<sup>th</sup> November 1910.

# 75. Tablet

Sacred to the memory of RACHEL, wife of Colonel L.B. TAYLOR. Obit 31<sup>st</sup> March 1814, aged 40 years. This tablet is erected by her affectionate husband.

In loving memory of HENRY BAILEY, who for 28 years was Baritone Soloist in this church. Died August 1918

#### 79. Choir Stalls behind Lectern. Tablet

This tablet was erected by public subscription in loving memory of WILLIAM HODGE, sometime Precentor and Organist of this church and Sub-Organist of St. Paul's Cathedral. In token of his high character and musical attainments, who died July 15<sup>th</sup> 1895 aged 33years. A prize called "The Hodge Memorial Prize" was also established at the same time, Jan. 18<sup>th</sup> 1896.

She lived desird and dyed lamented on the leaventh of December A.D. 1658.

**133.** In Memory of a life devoted to the study of Musical Science and shorten'd by unremitted application & anxiety in the attainment of its object this marble is inscribed with the name of STEPHEN STORACE. He died March 16<sup>th</sup> 1796 aged 34 and is interred under the Church.

In a vault beneath are deposited the remains of LETITIA widow of Lt. General the Honble. Edward STOPFORD who departed this life Feby 5<sup>th</sup> 1841, aged 85 years. This monument is erected as an humble tribute of respect to the memory of a much-loved mother, who was endeared to her family, and a large circle of friends, by the many virtues that adorned her character. Affectionate and benevolent, she was ever ready to succour those in distress, indulgent towards others, her own failings "leaned to virtue's side" and she was an Isrealite indeed in whom was no guile. Full of years – faith and love, she sweetly fell asleep, look for that blessed hope and the glorious appearing of the Great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ.
